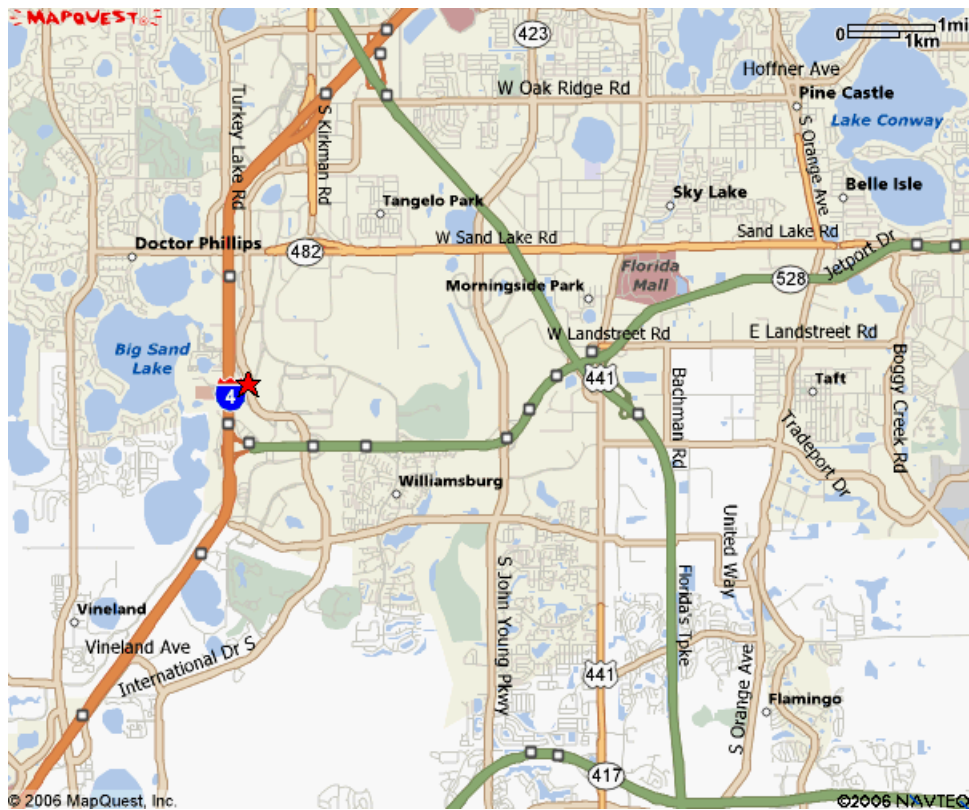

It does not mean if the interest is there, and the willingness surfaces you cannot have it more often that would simply require a motion to have a convention; since there is nothing in policy prohibiting it, and it would be a motion for a single convention, it would not establish policy and therefore would require a simple majority to accomplish, (That is our opinion at this point)

RCM REPORT

APRIL 8, 2007

The RSC meeting was held in the Tampa Fun Coast Area, 17 out of 17 were present.

May Regional (FRCNA Fun raiser) : Next RSC will be held in the World Golf Village Renaissance, 500 South Legacy Trail, St. Augustine, May 18-20. Room rates \$124. for bedroom and \$174. for a suite. Cut-off date for reservations is April 18th 2007. Call 1-888-740-8020 to make reservations and request group rate for FRCNA Regional Meeting.

Admin Committee Reports :

FRSC Ending Register Balance as of 2/28/2007 \$28,160.99

RD/AD Team : By all accounts the 2007 Florida Service Symposium was a great success. We have been in a proactive position developing our trusted servants. The Florida Region supports these efforts with both time and money. By now there are lots of folks in the Region who can facilitate a round-table process. For questions that delve deeper into the issues of Who's missing From our Meetings, Leadership Development, and Building a Stronger Home-Groups please go to the NA website. The Home-Group Worksheet and the Area Planning Tool are also available on-line.

World services is taking action to try to help better carry the message to targeted populations. IP's include a new one titled By Young Addicts for Young Addicts, and a piece geared toward the parents of young addicts. WCNA-32 will be holding workshops and meeting for youth, gay/lesbian, women, men and Spanish.

Basic text project ended at the close of February, and a release of the final draft will be in September. There are several issues related to the Basic Text that will be in the CAR when it is released this Fall. First the motion to replace the Stories, removal of the "Book One" and "Book Two" designations, the ability to update statistical information in the Preface, issues with the quotes in the Just For Today, also replacing the "N.A. with periods by NA with no periods." , from the Copyredits to Chapters 1-10. There are several pieces of New Service Material/Bulletins in the works or already available. There will be a Literature Distribution and Convention Workshop for the weekend of 9-10 November 2007 in California.

Of interest to the SEZF is the word on new Regions being seated at WSD. NAWS says: "the conference can no longer function effectively if small groupings of areas expect that changing their structures to meet local needs means they will also be seated at the WSC. We are recommending suspending the existing policy and adopting a moratorium on the seating of regions that result from regional splits until 2012.

Member who have not submitted or updated their World Pool Information Form in the last Three years will be contacted to update it or they will be removed from consideration in the upcoming WSC 2008 nominations process. The deadline for updates will be 31 August 2007.

FRSC : Area Reports

Bahamas Area : 7 meetings, 2 groups and 1 H & I presentation. Helpline with answer machine functioning and their Convention will be November 1-4, 2007. Requested PR workshop assistance from Rgion.

Bay Area : Oral report presented on the floor. See BASCNA.ORG for activities and more info.

Big Bend Area : 13 groups with 26 meeting per week. H & I carrying 7 meetings into 5 facilities per week. BBACNA X, to be held in August.

Chain O' Lakes Area : 10 groups and 15 meetings per week. Hosting a picnic at Hicorey Point Park on SR16 just outside Tavares on April 15.

Daytona Area : Convention April 27-29, Plaza Resort Daytona Beach.

First Coast Area : Will be hosting the May RSC, FRCNA-Fundraiser.

Forest Area : The FASC did an inventory of the Treasurer's books in January and found no discrepancies or problems. H & I is holding 8 presentations per month in 2 facilities. They have requested Region to attend the next FASC meeting which will be held April 15th @ 1pm.

Heartland Area : 35 H & I presentations in 9 facilities. In the process of starting a Heartland web page.

Palm Coast Area : 49 groups, meeting 74 times per week. H & I with 108 presentations into 20 facilities. Convention Committee is preparing for the 26th Annual Serenity in the Sun Convention, to be held on the Thanksgiving weekend. The First Annual Spring Fling and Sausage Fest to be held on Saturday, May 5th.

Recovery Coast Area : 13 groups holding 15 meetings a week. Helpline answered 38 calls last month. H & I 2 detox and 3 jail meetings a week. The area Treasurer went back out and took several checks with him, The total was over \$700. He came to the Feb. Area Service and informed about this plus returned \$300 on that day and stated the balance would be paid on the next week, which did not happen, they found out the Wachovia does not require 2 signatures for checks and they have since then made some changes.

River Coast Area : 12 groups and 20 meetings. Area is growing. H & I has 3 presentations.

Space Coast Area : Helpling had 68 calls for January, and 82 for February. H & I has meetings going into 2 facilities. Their Website is spacecoastna.org.

Suncoast Area : 38 groups with 50 meetings per week. H & I with 10 meetings into 8 facilities. Helpline answered 37 calls.

Tampa Fun Coast Area : Great job in hosting the Service Symposium. 62 groups with 93 meetings a week. H & I carrying 36 meetings into 9 institutions. The Area did 2 separate audits of the treasurer and everything was in order, there was only 10 cents missing. In response to their personalities before principles issues at their area the passed a motion to read page 367 from the Just For Today meditation "Service Motives" in their reading at the start of their ASC.

Treasure Coast Area : 35 meetings a week. H & I carrying 41 presentations a month. Their website is – www.treasurecoastareaNA.com .

Uncoast Area : 4 new meetings in the area. They have begun a Web Technologies Committee.

Fellowship Development : Any RCM can request a visit from Fellowship Development for a presentation. (See attached Budget).

Web Page :

Issues that need to be addressed are.... : qualified servants are difficult to maintain and retain in service, when a position becomes vacant information becomes stale and a person coming in behind rarely has the ability to get training. Web Page Subcommittee meeting are poorly attended, assistance with projects are difficult to staff.

For a solution we are looking to see if we can provide the region with professional services to maintain the website by: Transferring the webpage to a web development organization that has: A professional services company, experienced staff and expertise, been in existence for a significant amount of time, reference for handling service for larger organizations, reputation for reliability and quality of service and adequate support options and availability.

Website Projections : A plan to later extend services to the FloridaRSO.com Search Engine optimization to improve online sales. Offer website management to areas for hosting, content management delivery. All of this to give a consistent single look at feel to the Regional website, Florida RSO and all areas. This project will also add additional stream of income to the Florida RSO and assist areas in the management of their web presence.

Website Migration Step 1 : will provide the region with a (CMS) Content Management System. A CMS is a system used to manage the content of a Web site.

The new proposed budget will account for our migration to professional services,(see attached) .

Groups : 122 members in the Google Business Newsgroups, 139 members in the public newsgroup.

Currently working with an area to delegate permissions to the calendar system. This in turn will allow area websites to link to the Google calendar, update their events in one place and have it automatically distributed to all websites in the area and the Florida regional calendar.

FRC : The board participated in the Florida Symposium Area Convention Planning Workshop, which addressed commonalities inherent to all conventions, Planning , Resources and Public Image.

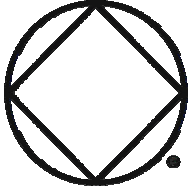

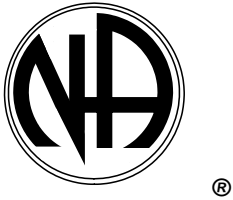
