II. Nominations/Elections of Officers

A. Vote of Acclamation

1. For the election of Area Chairperson, second term Regional Committee Member and Subcommittee Chairpersons, a vote of acclamation is requested for the Area Vice Chairperson, first term Regional Committee Member and Subcommittee Vice Chairperson provided they have served for six months in the respective positions. If the "vote of acclamation" does not carry with a 3/4 majority vote, nominations are solicited, and elections are held.

B. General Elections

1. Nominations for Area positions are solicited in June. Nominations are to be closed at the July ASC and elections will be held. ASC elections are to remain in conjunction with RSC elections.
2. The position is announced and an explanation of office is read from the Area Service Guidelines to establish **requirements for each**.
3. The Chairperson reads the Fourth Concept of NA Service:
"Effective leadership is highly valued in Narcotics Anonymous. Leadership qualities should be carefully considered when selecting trusted servants."
4. Nominations are accepted.
5. After accepting nominations the Chairperson will ask the floor if there are any further nominations.
6. A motion to close nominations must be made, seconded, and carried. If the motion to close does not carry, nominations will remain open until the following ASC meeting.
7. Before the actual elections, each nominee should state, in person, their qualifications for serving the Fellowship. They should state their clean time, past service experience, if they have the time and resources to serve in the position, and why they want to serve.
8. Questions for the nominees will be accepted by the Chairperson, if appropriate.
9. Individual votes will not be reflected on the tally sheet, only totals. A simple majority of the current roll call of the ASC is necessary for all ASC positions
10. Officers are to assume duties of the office at the end of business at the July ASC, except when filling a vacant position not a July (yearly) election position.

III. Business Procedures

A. Quorum

1. A quorum is more than half the current voting ASC membership.
2. A quorum must be established to deal with motions at ASC.
3. Once quorum has been established, no subsequent roll call can cause quorum to be lost.
4. A new group may be added to roll call by declaring its willingness to become a member of ASC. After 2 consecutive ASC attendances, the group will be added to Quorum and receive voting privileges.
5. A group missing its second consecutive ASC will be removed from Roll Call and will not be counted for quorum.

B. Recognition/Participation

- 1. **To be recognized on the floor, a raise of the trusted servant's placard is necessary.**
- 2. **To be recognized during "Open Floor", a raise of the hand is necessary.**

C. Motions

- 1. **Motion making/second will be allowed by the following: (moved from B. 2. above)**
 - **a. GSRs of voting groups or their alternates in their absence**
 - b. Primary RCM or Secondary RCM in Primary's absence**
 - c. Vice Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer, and Literature Distributor, when germane to their position**
 - **d. Subcommittee Chairperson or Vice Chairperson in their absence, when germane to their position**
2. Main motions must be submitted in writing to the Vice-Chairperson. It should be brief, clearly stated, and contain intent.
3. Motions that pertain to policy of the ASC or its Subcommittees
 - a. **Will identify the section(s) amended**
 - b. Will be tabled to groups.

4. Motions pertaining to finances will be brought to the floor and discussed in the order of the Fund Flow Chart.
5. The Treasurer will make recommendations on all money motions.
6. ~~Any contract, which deals with funds over \$500, must be submitted to the most appropriate service board for the Florida Region before signing.~~
7. Housekeeping motions not changing current policy or procedures are not required to be tabled to groups. The tabling of these "Housekeeping" motions will be left to the discretion of the Vice Chairperson.

D. Discussion of Motions

1. All those ~~on roll call who may make or second motions~~ may participate in discussion.
2. Discussion from others ~~not on roll call not mentioned in the previous section~~ is at the discretion of the Chairperson

E. Voting/Voting Procedure

1. Motions not directly affecting Groups may be voted on by all trusted servants on the ASC roll call
2. Motions directly affecting Groups may be voted on by GSRs, or their alternates in their absence, exclusively
3. The Chairperson is responsible for determining if a motion directly affects the Groups.
4. A majority is defined as more than half of all members who vote yea or nay for business motions.
5. A minimum of 2/3-majority vote of Groups present is required to carry any procedure motion. This includes a motion to suspend the rules.
6. Motions pertaining to finances will be voted on in the order of the Fund Flow Chart.

F. Abstentions

1. Abstentions are to be eliminated from the vote tally. Therefore, motions are carried or defeated by those casting either a Yea or Nay vote.
2. ~~For the purpose of possible reconsideration, abstentions will go to the prevailing side of the vote.~~
3. Any group on the current roll call leaving prior to the close of business will have their vote counted as an abstention after their leaving.

This second Ad-Hoc on Hearing Impaired was formed at the November 2009 ASC when Motion #091004, "To start the training process of the recommendation of the Ad-Hoc on Hearing Impaired," carried.

4 member from prior meetings were excused, 2 not excused

At the January ASC, we asked our RCM's to request ESH from other Areas of the Florida Region. Our RCM's brought us information and suggestions from 5 other Areas. This information pertains to interpreting at meetings, not training our trusted servants in ASL.

- Uncoast – hearing impaired addict brought his own interpreter to meeting
- Big Bend & Bay & Sun Coast – member, who's a professional signer, volunteered to sign once a week.
 - Signing at meetings helps those who want to learn ASL practice their skill
 - Check local colleges for internship programs
 - Consult Special Needs Handbook
- Forest – consult yahoona_pi.org
- Daytona – internet service called video relay

We were also advised to speak with the ASL certified interpreter who is a member of the Bay Area fellowship, Aralyn. Aralyn believes that training our members to sign may be a violation of our Traditions, however employing an interpreter to interpret our message is not a Tradition violation. She referred us to Kristi-Beth from the Bay Area and Bob Jordan, a former World Services Board member. Kristi-Beth informed us that the hearing impaired community have a language barrier and require a special service that hearing addicts don't need. There is no 8th Tradition violation, as evidenced when World Services hires ASL interpreters and language translators for its convention meetings. Bob is concerned that the training of our members could divert NA from its primary purpose, for NA is not an educational service, however he did think we should engage Lisa McClung as an interpreter, have one of our Ad-hoc members with intermediate level training review her skills and if she's appropriate and able to convey a pure NA message, continue to utilize Ms McClung's interpreting services and

allow her to teach our members who are willing to learn ASL.

At our 1/8 meeting, ad-hoc member, Jo C of Young and Free, was tasked with interviewing Ms. McClung. She has not yet done so and questions whether this interview is necessary for 2 reasons:

- 1) The emails on the goascna google group and the 1/22/10 Ad-hoc meeting disputing the compliance of the Ad-hoc's motion #1001006 to NA's Traditions
- 2) A new referral for a professional ASL interpreter, Amanda Davis

If motion #1001006 passes, the ad-hoc will follow-up with Ms. McClung's interview, regarding engaging her services for the deaf and hard of hearing addict(s) and coordinating the ASL meeting/training.

Most of the third Ad-hoc meeting, on 1/22/10, did not pertain to task of this Ad-hoc, "to start the training process" per motion #091004. Although the Ad-hoc Chair attempted to bring the discussion on topic and focused on training, the majority of new attendees continued with their purpose for attending this meeting, to discuss the 8th Tradition. Two new attendees tasked themselves. Susan C of Give It Up offered to research interpreter options and Gail S of Young and Free offered to research the Center for Independent Living. (Fyi, both tasks have been covered by the 1st Ad-hoc on Hearing Impaired. See their 2009 reports)

In-between the 2nd and 3rd Ad-hoc meetings, Floyd G of Man To Man, found a 'how-to learn ASL' on DVD at the public library. He has agreed to coordinate a self-help training class with those members of this ad-hoc who are willing to learn ASL. Yvette of Solo Por Hoy, our member from Osceola County, has decided to get the DVD locally and study on her own, due to the distance and time to travel. The members of this ad-hoc do not see any traditions violation since this training is free of charge and if a room can be secured free of charge.

SPECIFIC CONCERNS OR NEEDS:

The Ad-hoc has done all it can without a determination by the ASC whether GOASCNA is violating our Traditions by initiating an ASL training process to help carry the message to the hearing impaired addict. If the Area is in favor of hiring Ms. Lisa McClung to interpret the NA message in ASL once a week and train our willing members, as reported in the January 2010 Ad-hoc report, passing motion #1001006 will provide the necessary funds to engage Ms. McClung's services. This Ad-hoc is willing to continue to meet to co-ordinate the meeting/training. Otherwise, this Ad-hoc has completed its task and can disband.

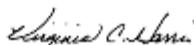
